Dr. Linda K. Gast is currently a Licensed Clinical Counselor in the Counseling Center at the University of Maryland where she is also an Assistant Affiliate Professor in the Student Affairs Concentration of the Department of Counseling, Higher Education & Special Education. She has over 35 years of experience in the field of career development and employment. From 1985-2003 she served as the
